The purpose of C.O.P.S. is to create a police and community partnership to reduce the likelihood of crime occurring in your area. This is accomplished by many techniques including training residents on how to recognize, report, and reduce community problems.

Benefits include:

- Learning techniques that will minimize the chance of you or your family becoming a victim of crime
- Learning how to recognize problems in your community and developing ideas to solve specific problems
- Getting to know your neighbors so that unusual activity will be noticed and reported
- Establishing a relationship between your neighborhood and the police department

Get involved and get results:

When your community chooses to participate in C.O.P.S., you become part of a police and community partnership that includes more than 200 neighborhoods in Gwinnett.

Your community will receive:

- Training from specialized officers
- Knowledge to effectively deal with local and neighborhood problems
- Special C.O.P.S. signage placed at the entrances of your subdivision
- Residential security surveys
- A personal relationship with your police department
- Periodic patrols from the Crime Prevention Unit
